**Leon County Supervisor of Elections Reminds Voters of Voter Registration and Party Change
Deadline for 2024 Primary Election**

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, reminds Leon County citizens that Monday, July 22 is the last day to register to vote or to change political party affiliation in time for the August 20 Primary Election. “I encourage all eligible Leon County residents to register to vote, or if you are already registered, make sure your voter registration record is updated with your desired party affiliation and current address,” said Supervisor Earley. “Voters have several options to register in Leon County, and my office will stay open late on July 22 to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to register or change their political party affiliation.”

Voters may register or change their political party using any of these methods:

- Online at [RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov](https://www.RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov) (complete by 11:59 p.m. on July 22).
- Mail a voter registration form to PO Box 7357, Tallahassee, FL 32314-7357 (must be postmarked by July 22).
- Visit the Leon County Supervisor of Elections Office at 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway (corner of Apalachee Pkwy and Capital Circle SE). Office hours are extended to 7 p.m. on July 22.

All Leon County voters who are registered by the July 22 deadline can vote in the Primary. All voters can vote in the nonpartisan contests on the ballot, including the “Universal Primary” in the Property Appraiser contest. In addition, voters registered with a party can vote in partisan contests for the candidates they want to represent their party in the November General Election. Some races will be decided entirely during the Primary Election, so voters who do not vote in the Primary will miss their chance to vote in these important contests.

Voters can view their current voter registration information, including party affiliation, by going to [LeonVotes.gov](https://www.LeonVotes.gov) and clicking on the “Your Voter Info” button. Voters can also use the same site to view their specific sample ballot for the Primary Election.
